It's been another busy year for ALHeLA, with many changes and new experiences...


- ✓ Instead of having an annual conference in the fall, this year's annual conference was held in March, a joint venture with GHSLA:

Happy Birthday MEDLINE! Happy Birthday MEDLINEplus!

(Bethesda, Md.) — It's certainly true that the phrase, "You've come a long way, baby," can be applied to MEDLINE, the National Library of Medicine's premier bibliographic database of 4,500 biomedical journals published in the United States and 70 foreign countries. This month, MEDLINE celebrates its 30th birthday. Its offspring, MEDLINEplus, a source of reliable consumer health information available on the World Wide Web, celebrates its third birthday this month.

In 1971, when doctors dressed in bell-bottom pants relied on trained librarians to do their searches, MEDLINE could "support 25 simultaneous users." Today MEDLINE is the world's largest medical database, accessible to all via the Internet, and it supports users who do 400 million searches each year. It began as a service for instantaneously searching medical literature for workers in medical schools, medical libraries, hospitals, and research institutions. At that time MEDLINE consisted of articles in the top 239

medical journals, 130,000 citations in all. There were search fees, limited access to computers, and cumbersome search engines that excluded public access - and most researchers and physicians as well.

Recognizing the need to help consumers find answers to medical questions, the Library launched MEDLINEplus in October 1998. MEDLINEplus is the Library's consumerfriendly source of up-to-date health information, with countless resources on health and wellness topics. Consumers and health professionals began using MEDLINEplus as the source of the most reliable and most accurate health information available on the World Wide Web. It now receives some 70 million hits each year.

MEDLINE and MEDLINEplus are changing health care delivery and educating patients with information that will make them better informed and ready to participate with physicians in making critical decisions.

The National Library of Medicine, a component of the National Institutes of Health, is home of one of the first Federal Web sites, created in 1994. The Library is the largest such institution in the world, and much of its collection is accessible through its site at http://www.nlm.nih.gov/.

Alabama Health Libraries Association Executive Board Meeting Friday, September 28, 2001

Present: Robert Avant, Everly Brown, Pat Higginbottom, Yvonne Kozlowski, Margo Mead, Marian Morris, Inga Moten, Tracy Powell, Lisa Rains Russell, Ellen Sayed, and Diane Williams.

Guest: Martha Verchot

- **1.** <u>Call to Order:</u> The meeting was called to order at 10:45 am by Marian Morris, President.
- **2. Approval of Minutes:** The minutes from the June 15, 2001 Executive Committee meeting were approved as written.
- **Treasurer's Report:** The treasurer's report was presented by Lisa Rains Russell, Treasurer. The balance as of 9/28/01 was \$11,113.63. This balance does not yet reflect the expenses of the 2001 joint meeting with GHSLA.

4. <u>Committee Reports</u>

- a. Bylaws: No report
- **b. Directory:** No report
- **c. Membership:** Marian Morris reported on behalf of Carolyn Holmes, membership chair. The organization currently has 58 members, 1 of which is a student member.
- **d. Synapse:** Diane Williams, *Synapse* editor, reminded the board that the deadline for submissions is in 2 weeks.
- **e. Union List Coordinators:** Robert Avant announced that after November 1, 2001, the Alabama Public Library Service will no longer maintain the Alabama Union List of Serials.
- **f. Web Coordinator:** Pat Higginbottom has updated the Executive Committee information on the ALHeLA website, making the email addresses active links. The handbook information has also been updated. The site has had 350 hits in three months. All ALHeLA members with valid email addresses have been added to the organization's online discussion list.
- **g. Nominations:** Diane Williams presented the slate of candidates developed by the Nominations Committee for consideration:

Vice President/President-Elect: Tracy Powell

Secretary: Inga Moten Treasurer: Martha Verchot

Members at Large: Everly Brown, CJ Bryant, Kay Fowler

Members of the Nominations Committee were Diane Williams, Geneva Staggs, and Yvonne Kozlowski.

h. Members-at-Large: No report.

5. Old Business

a. Scholarship for Members with Limited Institutional Support: The committee, made up of the Members-at-Large, has been looking at similar scholarships offered by other organizations. For the most

part, they require that an application and an essay be submitted. Most provide a given dollar amount and require participation at the meeting. For the ALHeLA scholarship, a more practical award might be to pay for all meeting expenses, since they vary widely. Awardees would be asked to provide receipts for meeting expenses and would then be reimbursed. The 2002 Members-At-Large will continue work on this project.

- **b. 2001 Annual Meeting with GHSLA-Update:** Marian Morris reported that final financial numbers from the joint meeting have not yet been received. Preliminary numbers indicate that total meeting expenses were around \$7600 for both organizations. Marian will continue to update the Executive Committee as new information becomes available.
- **c. Update on Archivist Agreement:** Yvonne Kozlowski reported that Tim Pennycuff has given her lots of information regarding the archives project. Any agreement with Tim cannot be finalized until June 2002, when the Archives Advisory board will have an opportunity to review and approve it. Tim will develop the agreement with our input. ALHeLA will have to pay for acid-free books and files, and pay a fee for the archivist to put the files in archival order.

6. New Business

- **a. Election of 2002 Officers:** A vote was held on the slate of candidates presented by the Nominations Committee. A total of 28 votes were cast, 12 in person and 16 by proxy. Margo Mead moved that the slate be accepted by acclamation; Lisa Rains Russell seconded the motion. Terms for the new officers will begin in January 2002.
- **b. Student Scholarship Competition for Fall 2002 Conference:** Marian Morris requested that Lisa Rains Russell, Martha Cook, and Nelle Williams continue to work on this project for 2002. The competition will be advertised in the spring, and the 2002 meeting will be held in mid to late September 2002.
- **c. Providence Hospital Library Situation:** One of ALHeLA's members had expressed concern to Marian about Providence Hospital's decision not to hire a full-time medical librarian. The Executive Committee discussed this decision and how it affects other medical libraries in the area.
- **d. 2002 Executive Committee Meetings:** The meetings of the ALHeLA Executive Committee will continue to be held at the Alabama Public Library Service. We are most appreciative of the hospitality of Robert Avant and APLS. The first meeting of the new year will be held in January.

e. Other

- i. New Treasurer: The election of a new treasurer necessitates a revision to the membership brochure. Marian will look into having new brochures made before the January meeting.
- **ii. Proposed ALHeLA Handbook Changes for 2002:** The following changes to the handbook will be discussed and voted on next year:
 - elimination of the position of Union List Coordinator
 - elimination of the position of Bookkeeper and ensuring that the description of the Treasurer position is up-to-date
 - addition of the Archivist position

7. <u>Announcements</u>

a. Lister Hill Library is celebrating the 30th anniversary of its dedication on October 22, 2001 at 1:00 pm.
