This program will serve to briefly review that meeting but even more to update what has been accomplished since--and lots has been done.

# Proposed Amendments

As set forth in the AIHeLA Constitution any proposed amendments may be voted on by the members present at any regular business meeting. However the proposed amendments must be submitted to the Executive Committee at least 8 weeks before the meeting and the proposed amendments distributed with the registration packets. Since the registration materials are being distributed by way of this issue of SYNAPSE, the By-Laws Committee has recommended to the Executive Committee the following amendments:

## Currently Reads

### Article III: Membership

Membership shall be open to all persons or institutions interested in the aims of the Association.

### Article IV: Finances

#### Section 1: Dues

The annual membership fee for the Association shall be \$10.00. Non-payment of dues serves as notice of resignation from the membership.

### Article VI: Election of Officers

#### Section 2: Nominating Committee

The out-going President, prior to the last meeting of the calendar year, will appoint and announce to the membership a nominating committee of not fewer than three members. No nominating committee member shall be an elected member of the Executive Committee.

### Article VII: Meetings

#### Section 2: Quorum

Two-thirds of the members present at an Association meeting shall constitute a quorum.

## Proposed

### Article III: Membership

Membership shall be open to all persons or institutions interested in the aims of the Association. Each institutional member shall from time to time designate to the Executive Committee in writing, one person to represent it in the Association, and such designated person shall, in such representative capacity, be entitled to all the rights and privileges of individual membership, including the right to vote, each institution being allowed one vote.

### Article IV: Finances

#### Section 1: Dues

Annual membership fee for each fiscal year shall be recommended by the Executive Committee and set by the Association at its annual meeting. Non-payment of dues serves as notice of resignation from the membership.

### Article VI: Election of Officers

#### Section 2: Nominating Committee

The out-going President, prior to the last meeting of the calendar year, will appoint and announce to the membership a nominating committee of not fewer than three members. No nominating committee member shall be an elected member of the Executive Committee. The nominating committee shall report election results in the first published issue of the SYNAPSE following the election.

### Article VII: Meetings

#### Section 2: Quorum

Two-thirds of the members present at an Association meeting shall constitute a quorum for transaction of business.

# RML Satellite Librarian

The Satellite Program has been active for six months now and many things have happened during that time. I have been "on the road" some this summer, attending meetings and making site visits. In July, I visited Mobile and Pensacola, where I toured facilities and talked with librarians. My thanks to Mary Ann and Bob Donnell, Pat Hall, Geneva Bush, Barbara Shearer, Judy Johnston, and all the others who shared their time, observations, and insights with me. I hope to visit other areas of the state in the near future.

Presently, the SRMLS office is involved with several projects. Karen Hackleman, RML2 Consultation Coordinator, and I are working to try to increase the number of names listed on the Region 2 Consultants Registry. Anyone not already on the Registry and interested in consulting for us may contact me at the Lister Hill Library for application materials.

A grant proposal was written and submitted to NLM in August requesting \$10,000 to purchase health care administration and management materials. These materials would be housed at Lister Hill and would be available for use by health science libraries in the four states served by the Satellite Program (Alabama, Florida, Mississippi, Tennessee). We are currently compiling lists of journals and monographs to be included in the collection. We would welcome any suggestions AIHeLA members have for purchases.

As you all know, the annual meeting of the Southern Chapter of the Medical Library Association is being held in Key Biscayne, Florida, October 10-13. I hope I will see some AIHeLA members there. RML2 staff members are teaching two workshops which I encourage interested persons to attend. They are the Consultation Update and Principles of Interlibrary Loan, taught by Karen Hackleman and Janice Kelly, respectively. Carol Jenkins, RML2 Executive Director, and Jane Lambremont, RML2 Education Coordinator, will both be giving presentations during the meeting, as well. They are sure to have lots of interesting information to share.

For those that are interested in the ILL workshop, but cannot attend the Southern Chapter meeting, I will be giving an ILL Update at the AIHeLA meeting in November. The manual produced by RML2, "Principles of Interlibrary Loan", will be available for purchase at that time. If you would like to acquire a handbook prior to November, they are available through me for \$7.50 each.

In my next column, I hope to have further details on the health care administration and management project and also on the new DOCLINE system. NLM hopes to start bringing libraries on in 1985. Until then, I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible in either Key Biscayne or Gadsden. We always want to know how you feel the RML program can best serve your needs.

The Alabama Health Libraries Association would like for the University of South Carolina School of Medicine Library to be the vendor for its union list project. Enclosed is a list of the participants, the contact person, and the SERLINE codes for each institution. Also, I have enclosed a proposed calendar for 1984-1985.

We understand that each institution will receive one printed copy of its holdings list (over 50,000 lines: Microfiche) and one microfiche copy of the library's designated union list for the following annual maintenance fee:

200 or fewer titles	\$ 75.00
201-500 titles	150.00

over 1000 titles	500.00

We are now in the process of holding a contest to determine a name for the union list. I will let you know as soon as one has been chosen. You should also be receiving letters from the directors of both the Lister Hill Library of the Health Sciences at the University of Alabama in Birmingham and the Biomedical Library at the University of South Alabama granting permission to add their holdings to the final union list product.

## PATIENT AWARENESS DURING GENERAL ANESTHESIA

Patient awareness of intraoperative events during general anesthesia has been a concern of physicians since the first public demonstration of anesthesia in 1846. 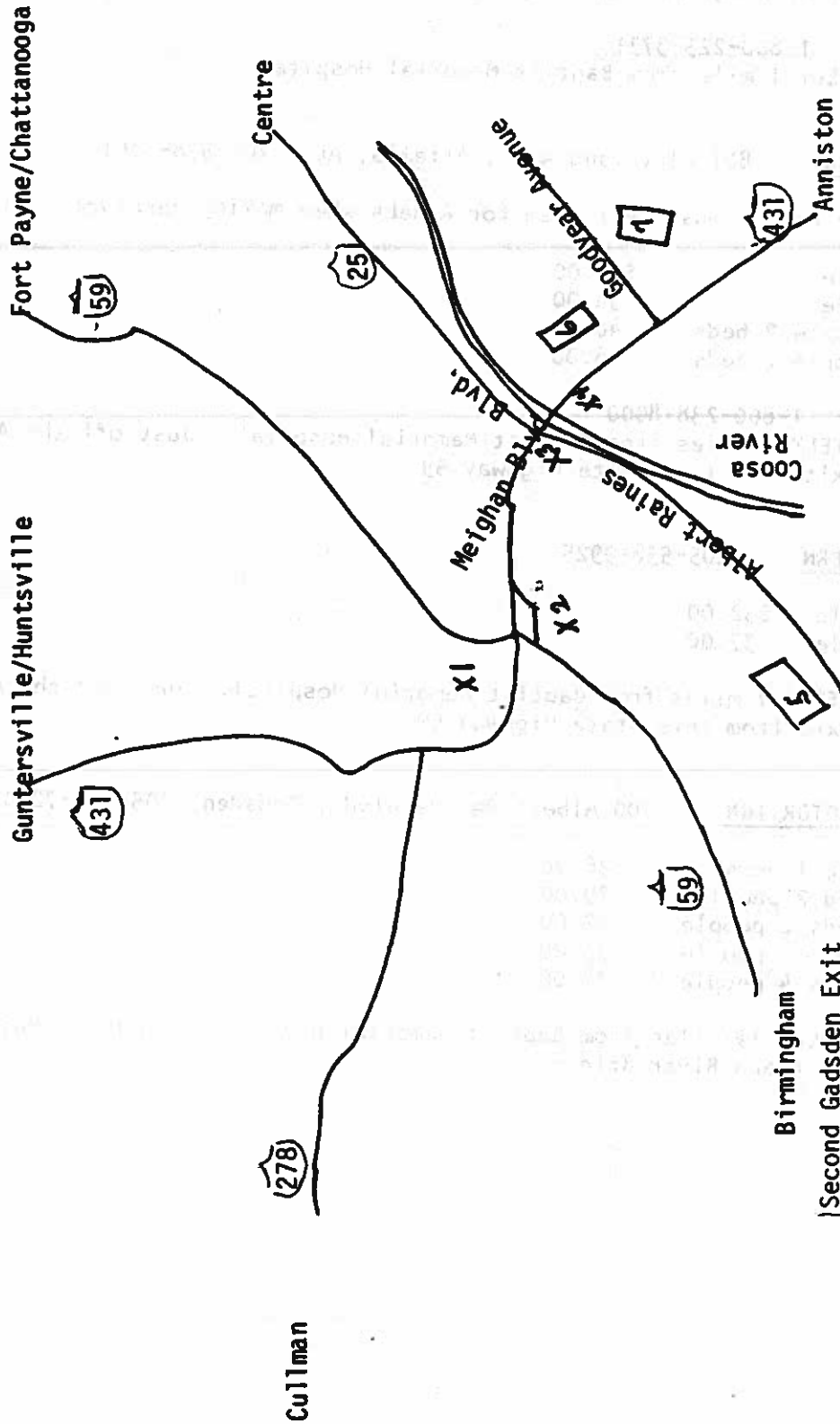
